

"He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Simon Peter answered and said, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.' Jesus answered and said to him, 'Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah, for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven. And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it'" (Matthew 16: 15, 16-18).

The Church is built by revelation-knowledge and vision that God gives through the Holy Spirit. The responsibility of the Church is to live in obedience to that revelation and vision. Jesus confirmed Peter's confession, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God," and said, "for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven...and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:16-18). This truth is the foundation of the Church. Building the Church on any other foundation and doing the work of God in man's own wisdom and ability is futile. The Psalmist declared, "Unless the LORD builds the house, they labor in vain who build it; unless the LORD guards the city, the watchman stays awake in vain" (Psalm 127:1). The Church that is built on Christ will have the Spirit's revelation and vision and Christ will be the source. He will provide for all her needs.


In the Old Testament, the altars spoke of "the place" where God met with man. Right from the beginning, God showed man how to build these altars. One clear example was when Elijah built the altar to challenge Baal's prophets (1 Kings 18:30-40). He repaired the altar of the Lord that was broken down and rebuilt it in accordance to God's specifications—the number of stones to be used, the trench around the altar, the arrangement of the wood and the

way the sacrifice was to be carried out and even the number of times water was to be poured over the sacrifice. Everything that Elijah did was by revelation-knowledge. Elijah prayed: "LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, let it be known this day that You are God in Israel and I am Your servant, and that I have done all these things at Your word" (v. 36). The power of God was manifested by fire that consumed the sacrifice on the altar and the

prophets of Baal were defeated because Elijah built the altar according to God's revelationknowledge.

When you build the Church with your own vision and wisdom, you will not only struggle, but God is not glorified. But when you build by God's revelation, you will have success and God will be glorified. Revelation-knowledge and vision must be from God for the Church to

Testimony

Praise God for His grace and mercy!

All praises to the Lord our God for He heals, He provides and He feels for us. I just want to share briefly how God has shown His unlimited grace and mercy upon my life, especially in the past few years and I hope that this testimony will be an encouragement to others.

I was working in the financial sector in 1996. However, due to inability to secure some licenses which affected business, the company had to close. God provided me a job a few months before the company was closed. The new company I joined in 1997 was doing fine until the financial crisis came. Business dried up and God again miraculously provided me with a job two weeks before the whole team was retrenched. God's timing is always perfect.

I got married in year 2000. About a year later, my dad was diagnosed with throat cancer. It has always been difficult for me to share Christ with my dad as communication had always been very much one way. The trial of cancer was difficult but I plucked enough courage to share the Gospel and prayed with my dad for the first time. We also talked more openly and he even accepted Christ, but he was still clinging on to his religious past at the same time. God in His grace and mercy completely healed my dad of his throat cancer.

Later, my dad needed a prostate operation. Before doctors could proceed, they found that two out of his three major heart arteries were blocked and he could have a heart attack any time. He had a difficult corrective operation but praise God for His mercy

on him. He went through it successfully. Another two prostate operations followed and the healing process took about two years. I believe that God had a purpose for all we went through. God was faithful to hear our cries to preserve my dad. We claimed His promise, "By His stripes we are healed".

Last year, it was my wife's turn to be told that the company she worked for was closing down. God, in his perfect timing, again provided a job just right after it closed down and she was compensated with a good retrenchment package, which was a blessing in adversity. Now, she has many Christian colleagues praying and serving together in their lunch-hour fellowship and she is reporting to a Christian boss.

God has blessed me in my current job by giving me a double promotion in five years. I had very good bonuses for the last two years because the sector was performing well. As I learned to give consistently, God has given me back more than I gave. The bonus came in useful because after a few years of trying for a baby, we decided to try assisted methods as a natural progression suggested by our doctor. God is all-

knowing and the Lord has been reassuring us of our inheritance through prophesies specifically to my wife a few

times

during Church Camp and lunch-hour fellowships at her workplace.

Hearing the many needs of the Church for Calvaryland and our Calvary Convention Centre (CCC), I prayed to God to intervene so that I can give the money we set aside, for these two purposes rather than use it for the treatment. God again showed perfect wisdom and timing. On the week that we were supposed to start the treatment, the pre-treatment blood test on my wife confirmed that my wife is pregnant. I have just given the money we set aside for the treatment to Calvaryland and CCC. I was also able to fulfil my Bite Size and Faith Promise commitments. God shows that He will bless when we choose to bless others.

I would also like to share that the Life Group is a "life-giving" group. Many fervent prayers were answered. The mother of one of our members was saved after more than ten years of prayer for her salvation and recently she was baptised in water. Another member's husband came back to God after many years.

We will continue to seek Him and put Him first in our lives and continue to trust Him for the salvation of our families and for a smooth pregnancy for my wife and a healthy baby whom we wish to dedicate for His work. All praise and glory be to God. 🔥

Jack Hanes, Senior Pastor of Penrith Christian Life Centre, Australia, was our special speaker.

We "seized the opportunity to pray" immediately after worship. Prayer leaders led small groups in the sanctuary to pray for their communities and themselves.

Gunapooshani, Calvary's Missionary to Sudan, since July 2003, reported God's awesome work in this country that is the direct result of our prayers, mission giving and obedience to bring the Gospel to the nations. Serving as the administrator and teacher at Harvesters' Christian School, she described Harvesters' as "a Christian community in operation, a seedbed for a new Sudan." Besides the orphanage that has seen a dramatic increase of children from 123 in 2003 to 420 in 2005, and with more than 300 children on the wait list, the Sunday School, Discipleship Class and Ministry for Widows and

Women are also experiencing a tremendous growth. This is truly a testimony of God's amazing love.

"God is a dreamer and a planner and when we pray according to His dream and plan, He hears us." This was the encouragement given by our speaker, Rev. Jack Hanes.

What then is His dream and plan? To preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth so that every human being hears about His salvation. The Gospel needs to be delivered by us, the major players in His dream and plan. Our Lord's part has been accomplished. It is our part now. There is a global harvest that is taking place right at this moment (John 4:35). Evangelical Christianity is growing at a rate of four times more than the birth rate. If we do not seize the opportunity to pray, to serve and to give

July 2005 | Faith Promise Sunday | Seizing Opportunity in Giving

"Will you seize the opportunity to give?" This is Senior Pastor Prince Guneratnam's passionate call to all Calvarities. He wanted everyone to understand this call. He described the four kinds of giving: tithing, love offerings, sacrificial and faith promise. He explained that the faith goal was set by our own faith. Senior Pastor further encouraged us, the Calvary family, that where God leads, He provides. What He orders, He pays. And when we step out in faith, God knows how to bless us for He looks at the giver and not the gift, the partner and not the amount.

"God's master key to abundant living is others," Rev. Jack Hanes stated. Jesus, he reiterated, is the master key to abundant life. Others, is the master key to abundant living.

To come to this, we must take on the mind of Christ and pour ourselves out, lay down our selfishness and give of our life to others. We are often caugh up in building our own security that is but a heartbeat from eternity. The spirit of the age is "self". The Spirit of Jesus is "others". One has to go for the other to come in. Our security is in our Source, the Lord God Almighty. He will provide for our needs as we provide for others. Rev. Jack Hanes related this to a pie. We cut slices to fill the various needs of our lives. We are careful not to give too much away just in case we have nothing left. He said that we are forgetting that our Father is the baker and therefore we can give our whole pie away without ever having our source depleted.

As in Roman 12:2, we should not let the world squeeze us into their mould. We measure how blessed we are by how much we have sacrificed, given and served. We, as children of God, are eternal and therefore that which is temporal should not be our focus. We need to look at those who do

not know Jesus. We need to make the decision to live in simplicity so that others can live for eternity.

A grain of wheat on its own is alone. Unless it is planted, it cannot multiply. And as it multiplies, more is planted and more is received. So it is with us. Our continuous giving has a multiplying effect not only to where it is given but also to the giver.

We may have only one short hour to win our victory for Jesus but all eternity to celebrate. The choice is ours. To pray, to serve and to give is the most God-like living a human being can ever experience.

grow and be strong. God has a plan and purpose for every Church.

This is also apparent in the account of how the Lord instructed Moses in the building of the tabernacle as recorded in Exodus 25 to 30. The Lord said: "And let them make Me a sanctuary, that I may dwell among them.

According to all that I show you, that is, the pattern of the tabernacle and the pattern of all its furnishings, just so you shall make it" (Exodus 25:8-9).

Every construction detail was spelt out for Moses-the tabernacle, the making of the Ark of the Covenant, the altar of incense, the table for the showbread, the gold lampstand, the bronze laver, the altar of burnt offering and the court of the tabernacle. Even the way in which the priestly garments which include the ephod, the breastplate, tunic, turban, sash, trousers, etc., were to be made, were clearly specified. God listed all the raw and other materials that the people were to bring for the making of the tabernacle. They included gold, silver, bronze, blue, purple and scarlet threads, fine linen and goat's hair, ram's skins dyed red, badger skins and acacia wood, oil, spices and onyx stones. God gave Moses the blueprint for the tabernacle and the furnishings right down to the minute detail. Everything had significance. God never tells us to do anything that has no significance. Notice the manner in which they were to give. It has not changed. When you give an offering, it must be with a willing heart. "Speak to the children of Israel, that they bring Me an offering. From everyone who gives it willingly with his heart you shall take My offering" (Exodus 25:2).

How does God build His Church? In the same way as the tabernacle was built—by revelation knowledge and by His children. There is no better way. That is why it is so important to hear God's voice and to move in the direction of His vision and revelation.

The Church is also built through



sons and through generations— His children and children's children. God is not referring only to biological families but to His people, the family of God. He is not referring to outsiders. When you receive the gift of salvation, you become His child. "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become the children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God" (John 1:12-13). God builds His Church through you—His sons and through your children's children.

In the Old Testament, when God referred to Himself, He described Himself as the God of Abraham, of Isaac and of Jacob. He is the God of generations of believers. God promised to make Abraham the father of a great nation. He would build this nation through sons. In Abraham's case, it would be through Isaac, the son of God's promise. It is the will of the Lord that sons, His children, build His church.

God's sons build and serve the House of God. There are churches today where hired servants are serving in the House of God instead of true sons. There is a great difference between the service of a son and that of a hired servant.

Let us consider some differences. Sons build the house. Hired servants merely serve. They are not interested in the development and growth of the household.

Sons hold the father's heart and the success of the father's work as their own. Hired servants do not.

Sons are family oriented. Hired servants are issues oriented.

Sons use the language of family, such as "we", "us" and

"ours". Hired servants use terms such as "me", "mine" and "they".

Sons honour headship and "cover the nakedness of their father". In Genesis 9: 20-27, Ham saw Noah's nakedness and told his brothers. "But Shem and Japheth took a garment, laid it on both their shoulders, and

went backward and covered the nakedness of their father. Their faces were turned away, and they did not see their father's nakedness" (Genesis 9:23). Hired servants will expose the nakedness of the father. Backslidden sons can act like servants, as in the case of Ham.

Sons do not compromise. They see the wrong but are ready to strengthen and help the family to move on. Hired servants, instead, let others see the shame of the household.

Sons honour the chain of command. Hired servants question the chain of command.

Sons want to share their lives with their fathers to the second and third generation. Hired servants are self-centred and live for themselves.

Sons carry on the vision of the father to the next generations. Hired servants have no concern for the vision.

Sons bond new people to the father and the house. Hired servants bond new people to themselves.

Sons focus on the welfare of the household. Hired servants focus on appearance and themselves.

Sons share their concerns and interests with their father. Hired servants are secretive.

Sons feel secure and can handle discipline. Sons know their father disciplines because he cares. Hired servants rebel when disciplined.

The challenge is to build the House of God. Serve His household like sons and not like hired servants. Recognise that you belong to the family of God. With revelation-knowledge, serve as a son and you will see the Church grow as a testimony for His glory. Are you a son or a hired servant?
