The Objective of God's Grace

The grace of God is at work in believers for a particular purpose to make for Himself a people that is His very own.

"For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men. It teaches us to say 'No' to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, while we wait for the blessed hope—the glorious appearing of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good.

These then are the things that you should teach. Encourage and rebuke with all authority.

Do not let anybody despise you." (Titus 2:11-15)

God's grace has an objective. The grace of God is at work in believers for a particular purpose—to make for Himself a people that is His very own. The King James Version of the Bible refers to these people as "peculiar"—not because they look queer or are misfits but because they have been changed in their character and have become more like Jesus in their behaviour. The change within, is a born-again experience that Jesus spoke of to Nicodemus in John three, verses one to eight. The Bible (1 Peter 2:9) refers to these people as "a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God". It is not your own ability or positive thinking that changes you but the miracle power of the grace of God that works in you.

God's grace is a miracle. The birth of Jesus Christ is a work of God's grace. When the angel Gabriel told Mary that she would give birth to a son, the Son of the Most High, her response was, "How will this be since I am a virgin?" (Luke 1:34). The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you" (Luke 1:35). It was God's grace and not Mary's willpower or positive thinking that was going to

accomplish what was to happen and what she was to become, "the Lord's servant" (Luke 1:38) or "the maidservant of the Lord (NKJV). Another of God's grace is seen in the feeding of the multitudes with just five loaves and two fishes. It was the grace of God at work providing and bringing about the power and glory of God. And it was by the miracle of God's grace that the walls of Jericho came tumbling down. The grace of God is God's

power working on your behalf. Let His grace be manifested in your life. Welcome and embrace His grace into your heart and expect a miracle.

God's grace teaches you to live a disciplined life (Titus 2:12). The challenge believers face is saying "No" to invitations to go to undesirable places and the participation in unholy conversations and activities. God's grace not only teaches you to say



On the first night we were privileged to have Senior Pastor Prince Guneratnam challenge us to be good examples as growing boys. 



"No" to ungodliness but gives you the power and strength to live a godly life by yielding the members of your body as instruments of righteousness (Romans 6:13).

The Bible (Romans 1:18-32) tells us what ungodliness is. It is suppressing truth by wickedness (verse 18). Ungodly people know what is right but refuse to do it. They suppress the truth by doing the very

opposite. They know God but do not glorify Him nor give thanks to Him (verse 21). They exchange the glory of the immortal God for the worship of manmade images, worshipping created things instead of the Creator (verse 23). These include ideologies and philosophies and anything that takes priority over God. They exchange the truth of God for a lie (verse 25). Telling the truth

hurts therefore they lie to help themselves. They exchange natural relations for the unnatural (verses 26-27). Instead of a man marrying a woman and living in a normal relationship, a man will have relations with a man and a woman with a woman. This is not the will and purpose of God for mankind.

They are filled with every kind of wickedness (verse 29)-evil, greed, envy, murder, strife, deceit and malice. They are slanderers, Godhaters, insolent, arrogant, gossips and boastful. Even believers can be quick to gossip about things that do not edify and slow to spread what is good for the building up of the Body of Christ. Slanderers say things based on hearsay only and bring down Christian leaders and the Church. The arrogant have an unteachable spirit. They are not humble and cannot receive correction. The ungodly invent ways of doing evil and disobey their parents (verses 29-30). They are senseless, faithless, heartless and ruthless and approve of those who also practise them (verse 31-32). The ungodly also includes those who do not do anything about ungodliness. Their lack of action amounts to approving and encouraging ungodliness to be practised.

The grace of God that teaches you to say "No" to ungodliness also

teaches you to say "Yes" to godliness, truth, honesty and being clothed with compassion. The Bible says,

"...godliness with contentment is great gain (1 Timothy 6:6). You will be called Christians as the people in Antioch when they saw the disciples of Jesus. Your lifestyle will then attract people to God. Christians need to take heed to what Jesus said in Matthew 12:43-45. Jesus spoke

about an evil spirit that came out of a man. It looked for another place to rest and did not find it. It then decided to return to the house it had left. Finding it unoccupied, swept, clean and put in order, went and took seven more wicked spirits with it to live there. The final condition of the man was worse that it was at first. This means that when you have been born-again and have experienced the grace of God, you must allow the Holy Spirit to fill you and lead you. The Bible says, "...those who are led by the Spirit of God are the sons of God" (Romans 8:14). Otherwise, like the man that was delivered from the evil spirit, you will be in a worse condition than you were before. You may discover that some of the bad habits that you had before becoming a Christian have become more difficult to get rid of. The Devil will take advantage of your backslidden condition. This is why some Christians are not living victoriously. Let the grace of God teach and fill you with the Holy Spirit today and everyday.

The grace of God gives hope. It teaches you that you can live a victorious Spirit-filled life in this present age while you wait for the blessed hope, the glorious appearing of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ (Titus 2:12-13). Live in anticipation of Christ's coming. What happens when

He comes? You will be fully redeemed—spirit, soul and body. The Bible (1 Corinthians 15:51-53) says, "Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable.

and the mortal with immortality". Jesus said, "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am" (John 14:3). You will be with Christ and will reign with Him. "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his throne in heavenly glory" (Matthew 25:31).

In times of

discouragement, lift up your eyes because Jesus is coming again. When you know and have faith in His soon return, the Bible says this hope purifies you so you can press on. Jesus will reward those who are good and faithful servants and invite them to enter into the joy of the Lord. Be encouraged by the example of Zacchaeus, the tax collector. He invited Jesus to his home and salvation came to his house. He made right what he had done wrong. "But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, 'Look Lord! Here and now I give half of my possession to the poor and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.' Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house..." (Luke 19:8-9).

The objective of the grace of God is to make for Himself a "peculiar" people—redeemed, forgiven and full of the love of God. Therefore do not practise sin but live a godly lifestyle, zealously doing His will and doing good works. Be filled with the Spirit (Ephesians 5:18).
