Grace Beyond Measure (General) 8 Nov- 13 Dec (6 weeks)

The Apostle Paul. The converted terrorist, inspired author, amazing teacher and patient mentor. This colossal figure strode boldly onto the stage of the first-century world and left an indelible signature of greatness never to be forgotten. Tough, tenacious and fiercely relentless in the face of hardships and sufferings, he pursued his divine mission with unflinching resolve. Once a violent tormentor of God's people, he understood and explained grace better than any of his contemporaries. And that's because he experienced grace beyond measure. If the "chief of sinners" can become God's chosen vessel, we too can become people of both grace and grit.

The Theology Series. . . Sojourners in a Hostile World (General)

As Christians, how should we conduct ourselves in a society that has differing values and often hostile to our faith in Christ? Why do we try so hard at times to "fit in" and get approval from a world we are no

longer a part of? The book of 1 Peter reminds us of our identity in Christ that sets us apart from others and calls us to a new way of life. As "sojourners," we are to look forward to our citizenship in heaven and live such honorable lives that the world may see our good deeds and glorify Christ.

Mandarin Class: Book of James 8 Nov-13 Dec (6 weeks)

The consistent focus of the book of James on practical faith is reminiscent of the Wisdom Literature in the Old Testament, encouraging God's people to act like Christ's followers. The pages of James are filled with direct commands to pursue a life of holiness. He makes no excuses for those who do not measure up. In the mind of this early church leader, Christians exhibit their faith by living a consistent lifestyle characterized by good deeds. For James, a faith that does not produce real life change is a faith that is worthless.

Cantonese Class: Members One of Another (8 Nov-13 Dec (6 weeks)

God has directed Christians to build one another up through inter-dependence and loving relationships. Gathering together as the Body of Christ draws us close to God as we praise Him and encourage one another. Paul puts it in Romans 12:5, "so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another." The One Another's command exhorts us to consider not just our personal relationship with Jesus, but our relationship with others in the local church. This study will explore the imperative of loving one another, forgiving and bearing up with one another.
